## Chairman's Report

This year LEAP has continued its commitment to helping prevent substance abuse in Hong Kong despite a peripatetic existence. After 15 years in Stubbs Road, in December 2010 LEAP had to move its office due to redevelopment of the site. Thanks to Swire Properties, LEAP was able to move to a temporary office in Westlands Centre, Quarry Bay, but the Static Centre had to be temporarily suspended. Nevertheless, LEAP's programmes were delivered to 87,443 students in the 2010/2011 academic year, only a small decrease from 88,781 last year.

LEAP has now found a new permanent home Quince Chong Chairman, LEAP at Lai Yiu Estate, Kwai Chung and will 莊偉茵女士 生活教育活動計劃主席 move to the new premises in early 2012. We are grateful to the Housing Department for providing the site which will enable the re-opening of an even more spacious Static Centre. Andy Lau Tak Wah, LEAP's Health Ambassador who sponsored the fitting out of the original Centre in 1996, has generously agreed to continue his support and work on the new Centre will begin towards the end of this year. We thank him very much for his continuing commitment to LEAP.

As before, the Static Centre will be used to deliver LEAP's Primary Programme to schools which cannot accommodate our mobile classrooms. We also plan to offer our Parent Programme at the Centre which will be ideally located for parents living in Lai Yiu Estate and nearby.

In August 2011 the Hong Kong Government's Census and Statistics Department's thematic household survey, conducted from October to December 2010, reported a reduction in Hong Kong's smoking population. Only 11.1% of people aged 15 or older were daily smokers last year, one of the world's lowest rates, down from 12% in 2009. Teenage smoking increased to 2.5% of those aged 15-19 smoking, up from 1.8% in 2009. However, the survey was conducted before the tobacco tax increase of 41.5% in February 2011 and despite the slight increase from the year before, the general trend over the past decade is a decrease in teenage smoking. LEAP has always worked closely with the government and other agencies towards a smoke-free Hong Kong and is encouraged by the continuing reduction in the smoking population. Preventive education is the best method to reduce smoking in young people and LEAP will further strengthen its Year 5 and Year 7 anti-smoking programmes, urging students to spread the anti-smoking message to their families and friends.

The Action Committee Against Narcotics (ACAN) also reported a reduction of 12.7% in the number of reported drug abusers in the first quarter of 2011 (from 4,602 to 4,018); as well as a 39.9% drop in the number of reported young drug abusers under 21 (from 1,110 to 667) compared to a year ago. 仍然堅守著香港預防藥物濫用的工 作。因土地重建發展關係,LEAP 於二零一零年十二月撤出駐紮了 十五年、位於司徒拔道仲安堂的辦 公室。感謝太古地產有限公司的幫 助,LEAP的臨時辦公室已遷至鰂 魚涌的華蘭中心,固定教育中心因 而需暫時關閉。儘管如此,二零一 零至一一學年,LEAP仍然為八萬 七千四百四十三名學生提供服務,較 去年八萬八千七百八十一人只略為 減少。

一如以往,固定教育中心將會為未能容納流 動課室的學校提供小學課程。藉地利之優 勢,LEAP亦計劃於固定教育中心內為麗瑤邨 及鄰近地區居住之家長提供家長教育課程。

政府統計處於二零一零年十至十二月期間進 行主題性住戶統計調查,並在二零一一年八 月公佈香港吸煙人口下降。二零一零年全港習 惯每日吸煙的十五歲或以上的人口只有百分之 十一,少於二零零九年的百分之十二,是全球 其中一個吸煙人口比率最少的地方之一。十五 至十九歲青少年吸煙人數,則由二零零九年的 百分之一點八,升至百分之二點五。然而,調 查乃於煙草稅在二零一一年二月增至百分之 四十一點五之前進行,而儘管人數較去年有輕 微增加,青少年吸煙的趨勢在過去十年整體仍 是下降。LEAP一直與政府及其他機構緊密合 作,致力推動無煙香港文化。吸煙人口持續減 少,我們著實鼓舞。要減少青少年吸煙,預防 教育是最有效的方法。LEAP會進一步加強五 年級及中一控煙課程,鼓勵學生將控煙信息傳 遞給親友。

禁毒常務委員會(ACAN)亦於二零一一年 第一季錄得被呈報吸毒總人數由四千六百零 二人降至四千零一十八人,跌幅為百分之 十二點七。與去年比較,二十一歲以下被呈 報青少年吸毒人數亦減少了百分之三十九 點九,由一千一百一十人減至六百六十七

Committee Against Narcotics and the Narcotics Division were encouraged but said they would not slacken their efforts to continue collaborating with different sectors of the community to sustain the trend, emphasizing the continuing need for antidrug measures including preventive education. The positive development spoke for the effectiveness of the joint efforts of the Government, the school sector and the community, including parents. LEAP will continue its role in the provision of prevention education programmes to both students and parents in support of the healthy development of the young people of Hong Kong.

LEAP's CEO Constance Ching will retire from LEAP at the end of 2011 after 10 years' dedicated service. I would like to thank her sincerely for her great contribution made over the years in advancing the goal of LEAP effectively in the community. She will be missed by the Board and her colleagues. New Executive Director Heidi Lau joined LEAP on 1 September with Constance staying until the end of 2011 to ensure a smooth handover. During the year, Humphrey Choi, Lydia Lee and Hunter Crawford resigned as directors and we welcomed Joy Slosar to the Board.

LEAP is grateful for the continuing support of its two major sponsors, Swire and Cathay Pacific. Our heartfelt gratitude also goes to The Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust, the Education Bureau, the Narcotics Division of the Security Bureau and our Health Ambassador, Andy Lau Tak Wah. ### Overview

LEAP continues to be the leading provider of preventive drug education for students and parents in Hong Kong. In the 2010/2011 academic year, LEAP's programmes, which cater to Hong Kong children from the ages of 5 to 15, were delivered to a total of 87,443 students.

LEAP maintained its high level of service to secondary students, which saw a more than 100% increase in the 2009/2010 academic year. This year LEAP's programmes reached 63,909 primary students, 18,426 secondary students and 5,108 special needs students, the latter representing an increase of 28%.

As reported by the Chairman, a significant decrease in smoking in Hong Kong was announced this year. A survey published by the Hong Kong Government's Census and Statistics Department revealed that only 11.1% of people aged 15 or older in Hong Kong were daily smokers in 2010, down from 12% in 2009, one of the lowest rates in the world. The Action Committee Against Narcotics (ACAN) also reported a reduction of 12.7% in the number of reported drug abusers in the first quarter of 2011, as well as a 39.9% drop in the number of reported young drug abusers under 21 compared to a year ago.

The figures are encouraging and a testament to the cooperation of LEAP with government agencies, schools, parents and the community in the war on drugs. However, there is no room for complacency and LEAP will continue steadfastly in its role of providing health-based preventive education programmes to help maintain this downward trend. LEAP's programmes crucially foster a healthy lifestyle for primary schoolchildren from a young age, and employ a sequential approach. The Secondary Programme aims to give teenagers the necessary self-esteem, knowledge and skills to resist peer pressure and say 'no' to drugs.

### **Programme Review**

Last year the Beat Drugs Fund granted HK\$1.36 million for the development of new programme materials and the implementation of LEAP's Secondary Programme for two years, from September 2010 to August 2012. As with all our programmes, the new materials aim to give students more knowledge of drugs and understand the consequences of using psychotropic drugs. The programme also focuses on developing social skills which enable

這些數字令人鼓舞,亦見證著LEAP與政府、學校、家長及社會協力打擊毒禍的成果。然而,LEAP不會因此而自滿,我們會繼續堅守崗位,提供健康及預防藥物濫用課程以延續下降的趨勢。LEAP循序漸進的課程,著重協助小學生從幼開始建立健康的生活模式。中學課程則旨在為青年人建立自信、提供知識及技巧去抵抗朋輩壓力及向毒品説「不」。

 students to cope with peer pressure and make responsible choices. New trigger videos and drug animations were produced and the new programme was piloted in March 2011.

In August 2011 the Tobacco Control Office granted HK\$1,399,960 for the complimentary delivery of anti-smoking programmes to Year 5 students in local schools for two years commencing in September 2011. The programmes aim to enhance students' understanding of the dangers of smoking and second-hand smoke, as well as to encourage students to promote anti-smoking messages to their adult family members and friends. In this way the programmes will help to nurture parent-child relationships, improve communication between different generations, contribute to establishing a smoke-free and healthy family and ultimately promote a smoke-free culture in Hong Kong.

LEAP's Parent Programme "Safe and Successful", launched in 2006, continues to be very successful. The programme offers advice to parents on how to tackle familiar problems such as rebellious behaviour and sex education, and how to recognize the early warning signs of drug abuse. Parents seize the opportunity to learn how to communicate better with their children and build a harmonious family environment.

### Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust Sponsorship

the purchasing of the first mobile classroom (LEC1) in 1993 and the renovation of LEAP's first office in Borrett Road. ### **New Office Premises**

LEAP had to leave its former office in Stubbs Road due to redevelopment of the site, and thanks to Swire Properties' support, moved to a temporary office in Westlands Centre, Quarry Bay, in December 2010. However, the Static Centre had to be temporarily closed. We are pleased to announce that LEAP has been successful in finding a new permanent home at Lai Yiu Estate, Kwai Chung, which will be rented at a charity rate from the Housing Authority. LEAP will move to its new premises in March 2012. The Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust has approved a grant of approximately HK\$3.1 million for the fitting out of the new office (see above).

The new premises will enable the re-opening of an even more spacious Static Centre than before. The Andy Lau Charity Foundation Limited, which generously sponsored the original Centre in 1996, has also kindly granted HK\$1.1 million for the fitting out of the new Static Centre. LEAP is most grateful for the continuing support of its Health Ambassador, Mr Andy Lau Tak Wah.

As before, the Static Centre will be used to deliver LEAP's Primary Programme to schools which cannot accommodate our mobile classrooms on their premises. Since its opening in 1996, some 87,000 students have visited the Static Centre. Approximately 6,000 students, as well as visitors from abroad, government officials, friends and

Dr Louisa Fu and Dr Anne Chee of the Tobacco Control Office (TCO), Department of Health, visited a Year 5 programme at Canossa Primary School on 14 January 2011, and the Form One anti-smoking programme at CCC Kei Chi Secondary School on 17 January 2011. The TCO focuses on three main areas – health promotion, tobacco control legislation and smoking cessation. Dr Fu and Dr Chee were interested to find out more about LEAP's

service. Dr Fu and Dr Edmond Ma, Senior Medical Officer of the Tobacco Control Office, visited another Year 5 programme at Chan's Creative School on 17 November 2011.

Dr Doris Yu, Associate Professor, Nethersole School of Nursing, Chinese University of Hong Kong and her colleague Ms Noble Po Ka Law attended a Year 3 class at St Mary's Canossian School on 24 January 2011, accompanied by Ms Kitty Liu of the Hong Kong Jockey Club. The Nethersole School of Nursing wished to gain some insight into the effective delivery of services using special vehicles.

Mr Andy Tam, Curriculum Development Officer of Moral, Civic and National Education, the Education Bureau, visited a Year 6 class at St Stephen's Preparatory School in Stanley on 23 February 2011. He also met the principal, Mrs Agnes Wai. The Education Bureau sponsors the salaries of two of LEAP's educators and visits LEAP's classes regularly to monitor the service.

Mr Takeru Makino, Hong Kong Bureau Chief of Yomiuri Shimbun, the leading Japanese newspaper credited with having the largest newspaper circulation in the world (over 10 million), visited a class in action at Hennessy Road Government Primary School on 11 March 2011. Mr Makino discussed with LEAP's Chief Executive Officer Constance Ching about how LEAP delivers its programmes and preventive

Ms Lau was very favourably impressed by seeing LEAP in action in both a local and an international school. She found students enthusiastic and the sessions informative and fun. Ms Lau said the Swire Group Charitable Trust believes that investing in educating children to lead a healthy lifestyle empowers them to make better life choices.

Seven members from different service teams of the YMCA visited the LEAP mobile classroom at Fanling Government Primary School on 8 April 2011 to learn more about drug prevention services in Hong Kong. Joyce Liu, Senior Education Officer, discussed with them LEAP's mission and philosophy, and its role in drug prevention.

Ms Patricia Wong and Ms Susan Lowcock, Charities Managers of the Hong Kong Jockey Club, visited the Haven of Hope Sunnyside School, a school for severely mentally handicapped students, on 16 June 2011. Ms Wong and Ms Lowcock were impressed by the dedication and expertise of the educators in providing a safe, warm and interactive learning experience for the students.

Dr Amy Chiu, Dr Anne Fung and Dr Jeff Lee from the Primary Care Office of the Department of Health attended a LEAP session at the Creative Primary School on 12 October 2011. They were interested in seeing LEAP's interactive delivery of health care messages.

On 6 December 2011, Mrs Pauline Chan and Mr Michael Lee, who became Board Members of LEAP on 7 December 2011, joined LEAP's Executive Director Heidi Lau, Deputy Director Vicky Chung and Year 3 students at the Canossa Primary School to learn more about LEAP's service in a mobile classroom.

### Conferences

#### 5th Cross Strait Conference on Tobacco Control

LEAP participated in the 5th Cross Strait Conference on Tobacco Control, held from 4 to 6 September 2011 in Taipei. The theme of the conference was a review of progress and looking forward to the World Health Organisation's Tobacco Control Framework. LEAP Trainer/ Educator Polly Wong delivered a presentation about LEAP's preventive education programmes.

The more than 400 participants comprised practitioners, academics and researchers on health, tobacco control and environmental protection from Taiwan, Mainland China, Hong Kong and Macau. Hong Kong was well represented by delegates from the Tobacco Control Office, Department of Health; the Hong

Kong Council on Smoking and Health (COSH); the University of Hong Kong's School of Public Health; and many more.

LEAP continues to work with Government agencies towards a smoke-free city. Thanks to education, legislation and taxation, smoking in Hong Kong has fallen from 23% in the early 1980s to 11.1% today. However, much remains to be done to further prevent and control tobacco use in Hong Kong, especially among young people.

### 7th Mainland, Hong Kong and Macau Conference on Prevention of Drug Abuse

The LEAP team attended the 7th Mainland, Hong Kong and Macau Conference on Prevention of Drug Abuse, held in Hong Kong from 19 to 22 September 2011. Senior Education Officer Vence Poon delivered a presentation on LEAP's programmes. After the conference, LEAP educators visited service agencies to learn more about the services provided to young drug abusers in Hong Kong. The team from Life Education Macau also participated in the conference.

We are most grateful to Ms Vivienne Tam and honoured that she has chosen to support LEAP's mission of helping young people develop in a positive way. We are also delighted that Ms Tam has accepted LEAP's invitation to be the first of LEAP's "Life Buddies", and will join hands with us, and our Health Ambassador Mr Andy Lau Tak Wah, in our efforts to prevent substance abuse, and to help young people develop a healthy, drug-free lifestyle.

### 參觀路德會青欣中心

二零一零年八月十七日,LEAP 副總幹事鍾瑋 嬿帶領一眾教育幹事到訪位於上水的香港路德 Service Cheer Lutheran Centre in Sheung Shui. The Centre is one of 11 Counselling Centres for Psychotropic Substance Abusers run by the Hong Kong Government and operated by NGOs. The educators learned about trends in youth drug abuse, as well as counselling and rehabilitation services in Hong Kong. The knowledge

gained will help us to develop an even more effective drug prevention programme.



LEAP's consultant Matthew Lui Yu Chun visited LEAP on 20 December 2010 to talk about his work with parents and young people. The recipient of an Outstanding Young Persons Award in 2006, Mr Lui overcame huge challenges in his early life, finally graduating with a first-class honours degree in religion and philosophy from the Baptist University and a master's degree from the Chinese University. After teaching for several years at a vocational college for students who have trouble fitting into the normal system, he established an education centre to offer training to students, parents and teachers, as well as corporations.

Mr Lui firmly believes in LEAP's philosophy of educating children about healthy living from a young age and continuing this into the teenage years. He was very encouraging about LEAP's work and has since given advice on our new Secondary Programme.

### Diembe training session

The LEAP team attended a djembe (African drums) training session on 17 August 2011. The educators were encouraged to each create their own beat and rhythm, yet together form an orchestral ensemble. Rising to the challenge, they learned how to apply a musical activity to developing teamwork, creativity and organizational skills.

### Visit to St Stephen's Society

On 18 August 2011, CEO Constance Ching and Deputy Director Vicky Chung led the educators on a visit to St Stephen's Society in Shing Mun Springs, New Territories. St Stephen's is a residential drug rehabilitation agency which provides a safe and secure environment for drug detoxification, while helping drug abusers to regain hope and a future.

The

visit was a valuable experience that inspired the LEAP educators to continue their efforts in promoting drug prevention education to young people.

#### Macau Visit

A visit to Macau was organized for the LEAP team on 26-27 April 2011. It was a valuable experience both for team building

and learning more about Life
Education and anti-drug policies
in Macau. In addition to observing
a class in action led by Macau
educator Claudia Cheung, the team
was introduced to Macau's antidrug policy and practices by Mr
Wilson Hon, Chief of Department
for Prevention and Treatment
for Drug Dependence, and Ms
Lucilia Hoi, Chief of Division of
Prevention of Drug Abuse.

During the visit, the LEAP team visited the Drug Treatment Complex Centre. Ms Loretta Lei, Chief of Division for Treatment and Social Rehabilitation,

introduced the drug control tactics used by the Macau government, and the evolution of treatment and rehabilitation services. The team also visited the "Smart Youth" centre run by the Macau Christian New Life Organisation to provide drug abusers or potential abusers with a safe environment for recreational purposes.

### Life Education Macau

Life Education Macau began its second decade of health education with the launch of a series of locally produced films entitled "Selection", "Refuse" and "Consequences". Featuring Harold the giraffe and his friends, the cartoon animation films promote messages of refusing drugs and awareness of public health.

Additional mobile classrooms will be introduced to the fleet, while the older mobile classrooms will be gradually replaced to ensure a safe, hygienic and state-of-the-art learning environment for young students. Sustainable development will be our goal, while always looking ahead and exploring new opportunities.

### LEAP - Who We Are

Life Education Activity Programme (LEAP) is a registered charity that provides internationally recognized health awareness and drug prevention programmes for primary and secondary schoolchildren. It helps them establish a healthy lifestyle and become aware of the dangers of drugs, including cigarettes and alcohol. LEAP's programmes are endorsed by the Hong Kong SAR Government's Education Bureau and Narcotics Division of the Security Bureau.

Life Education originated in Australia. The first Life Education Centre was established in 1979 by the Reverend Ted Noffs in Sydney, Australia. The concept spread throughout Australia and then internationally. Today Life Education operates in Australia, New Zealand, Hong Kong, Macao, Thailand, Indonesia, the UK, Hungary, Finland, Cyprus, Barbados and South Africa.

LEAP was founded in Hong Kong in 1994. Our primary programme is taken to schools in specially designed mobile Life Education Centres (LECs), which can be driven all over the territory. LEAP now operates seven mobile centres as well as a secondary school programme. Our programmes reach some 88,000 schoolchildren annually, including 5,000 students with Special Needs. In November 2006, LEAP launched "Safe and Successful", a programme which aims at equipping parents with skills to help their children establish correct values and to prevent substance abuse.

The LECs are designed to provide a relaxed environment for youngsters to enjoy the programme and become involved in discussions and role-play. Our specially trained educators make use of a modern audio-visual system, illuminated models of the human body, a 'talking brain' and games in the delivery of the programme. LEAP mascots Harold the Giraffe and Holly the Horse reinforce

生活教育活動計劃 (LEAP) 是一個計冊慈善機構,專 為中、小學的學生提供一套國際認可的健康教育及 預防藥物濫用課程,旨在讓他們明白到健康生活的 重要及濫用藥物的危險。課程獲教育局及保安局禁 毒處認可。

生活教育概念源於澳洲,首間生活教育中心由Ted Noffs牧師於一九七九年在澳洲悉尼創辦,之後此 概念傳遍澳洲,並擴展至世界各地。時至今日,生 活教育已在澳洲、新西蘭、香港、澳門、泰國、印 尼、英國、匈牙利、芬蘭、塞浦路斯、巴巴多斯及

生活教育中心設計新穎獨特,為學生營造輕鬆愉快的 學習環境。受過特別訓練的教育幹事們,利用中心內 的先進影音器材、會發亮的人體模型、會說話的腦袋 及各式互動遊戲授課。而 LEAP 的吉祥物「長頸鹿哈 樂」及「小馬凱莉」更會在課程期間跟學生説笑及唱 歌,從而進一步鞏固健康訊息。LEAP 透過循序漸進 的教學方式,讓學生認識人體的結構及藥物對它的影 響;而角色扮演更能協助學生建立社交技巧,懂得如 何作出正確的抉擇,有信心地拒絕煙酒等藥物並同時 保存自尊及友誼。

### Life Education Activity Programme Notes to the Financial Statements

For the year ended 31 December 2010

#### 1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The Company is a registered charity, incorporated in Hong Kong with liability limited by guarantee. The address of its registered office is Unit 1807, 18/F, Westlands Centre, 20 Westlands Road, Quarry Bay, Hong Kong.

The Company was engaged in providing educational courses during the year.

### 2. ADOPTION OF NEW AND REVISED HONG KONG FINANCIAL REPORTING STANDARDS

In the current year, the Company has adopted all the new and revised Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards ("HKFRSs") issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("HKICPA") that are relevant to its operations and effective for its accounting year beginning on 1 January 2010. HKFRSs comprise Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards ("HKFRS"); Hong Kong Accounting Standards ("HKAS"); and Interpretations. The adoption of these new and revised HKFRSs did not result in substantial changes to the Company's accounting policies and amounts reported for the current year and prior years except as stated below.

### **Presentation of Financial Statements**

HKAS 1 (Revised) "Presentation of Financial Statements" affects certain disclosures and presentation of the financial statements. The balance sheet is renamed as the statement of financial position and the cash flow statement is renamed as the statement of cash flows. All income and expenses arising from transactions with non-owners are presented in the statement of comprehensive income and expenditure, and the total carried to the statement of changes in equity. The owner changes in equity are presented in the statement of changes in equity. HKAS 1 (Revised) also requires disclosures of the reclassification adjustments and tax effects relating to each component of other comprehensive income for the year. HKAS 1 (Revised) has been applied retrospectively.

The Company has not applied the new HKFRSs that have been issued but are not yet effective. The application of these new HKFRSs will not have material impact on the financial statements of the Company.

### 3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards ("HKFRSs") issued by Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("HKICPA"), accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong and the applicable disclosures required by the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance.

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with HKFRSs requires the use of certain key assumptions and estimates. It also requires the directors to exercise their judgements in the process of applying the accounting policies.

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below.

### (a) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance are expensed in the income and expenditure account during the period in which they are incurred.

Depreciation of property, plant and equipment is calculated at rates sufficient to write off their cost less residual values over the estimated useful lives on a straight line basis. The principal annual rates are as follows:

Classroom and production related cost	12.5%
Classroom equipment, technologies/artworks	20%
Programme	20%
Office equipment	33.33%
Office decoration	33.33%
Motor vehicles	33.33%
Promotional materials	33.33%

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation method are reviewed and adjusted, if appropriate, at the end of each reporting date.

#### (b) Resale items

Resale items represent souvenirs purchased for resale and are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is determined using the first-in, first-out basis. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less the estimated costs necessary to make the sale.

#### (c) Trade and other receivables

Trade and other receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted on an active market and are recognised initially at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less allowance for impairment. An allowance for impairment of trade and other receivables is established when there is objective evidence that the Company will not be able to collect all amounts due according to the original terms of the receivables. The amount of the allowance is the difference between the receivables' carrying amount and the present value of estimated future cash flows, discounted at the effective interest rate computed at initial recognition. The amount of the allowance is recognised in income and expenditure account.

Impairment losses are reversed in subsequent periods and recognised in the income and expenditure account when an increase in the recoverable amount of receivables can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment was recognised, subject to the restriction that the carrying amount of the receivables at the date the impairment is reversed shall not exceed what the amortised cost would have been had the impairment not been recognised.

#### (d) Cash and cash equivalents

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents represent cash at bank and on hand, demand deposits with banks and other financial institutions, and short-term highly liquid investments which are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

#### (e) Other payables

Other payables are stated initially at their fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the effect of discounting would be immaterial, in which case they are stated at cost.

### (f) Revenue recognition

The Company relies on sponsorship from major corporations to cover the majority of the costs of running its programme. Sponsorship and Educator subsidies are recognised as income evenly over the periods specified by the donors. Amounts relating to future accounting periods are shown in the balance sheet as advance funding. Other income reflects the results of fund raising for capital equipment and future contingencies and is recognised upon receipt.

Interest income is recognised on a time-proportion basis using the effective interest method.

### (g) Employee benefits

### (i) Employee leave entitlements

Employee entitlements to annual leave and long service leave are recognised when they accrue to employees. A provision is made for the estimated liability for annual leave and long service leave as a result of services rendered by employees up to end of the reporting date.

Employee entitlements to sick leave and maternity leave are not recognised until the time of leave.

### (ii) Pension obligations

The Company contributes to defined contribution retirement schemes which are available to all employees. Contributions to the schemes by the Company and employees are calculated as a percentage of employees' basic salaries. The retirement benefit scheme cost charged to income and expenditure account represents contributions payable by the Company to the funds.

### (iii) Termination benefits

Termination benefits are recognised when, and only when, the Company demonstrably commits itself to terminate employment or to provide benefits as a result of voluntary redundancy by having a detailed formal plan which is without realistic possibility of withdrawal.

### (h) Impairment of assets

At the end of each reporting period the Company reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible assets except resale items and receivables to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have suffered an impairment loss. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated in order to determine the extent of any impairment loss. Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, the Company estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

Recoverable amount is the higher of fair value less costs to sell and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset.

If the recoverable amount of an asset or cash-generating unit is estimated to be less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount of the asset or cash-generating unit is reduced to its recoverable amount. An impairment loss is recognised immediately in the income and expenditure account, unless the relevant asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which case the impairment loss is treated as a revaluation decrease.

Where an impairment loss subsequently reverses, the carrying amount of the asset or cash-generating unit is increased to the revised estimate of its recoverable amount. However, the increased carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined (net of amortisation or depreciation) had no impairment loss been recognised for the asset or cash-generating unit in prior years. A reversal of an impairment loss is recognised immediately in the income and expenditure account, unless the relevant asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which case the reversal of the impairment loss is treated as a revaluation increase.

### (i) Provisions and contingent liabilities

Provisions are recognised for liabilities of uncertain timing or amount when the Company has a present legal or constructive obligation arising as a result of a past event, it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made. Where the time value of money is material, provisions are stated at the present value of the expenditures expected to settle the obligation.

Where it is not probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required, or the amount cannot be estimated reliably, the obligation is disclosed as a contingent liability, unless the probability of outflow is remote. Possible obligations, whose existence will only be confirmed by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more future events are also disclosed as contingent liabilities unless the probability of outflow is remote.

### 4. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT

The Company's activities expose it to a variety of financial risks: liquidity risk and interest rate risk. The Company's overall risk management programme focuses on the unpredictability of financial markets and seeks to minimise potential adverse effects on the Company's financial performance.

### (a) Liquidity risk

The Company's policy is to regularly monitor current and expected liquidity requirements to ensure that it maintains sufficient reserves of cash to meet its liquidity requirements in the short and longer term.

### (b) Interest rate risk

The Company's exposure to interest-rate risk arises from its bank deposits. These deposits bear interest at variable rates varied with the then prevailing market condition.

The new classification of the accounting items was considered to provide a more appropriate presentation of the state of affairs of the Company.
