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Chairman's Report 主席報告

In my first year as Chairman of Life Education Activity Programme (LEAP), I was delighted to witness the launch of our sixth mobile classroom, generously donated by the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust. LEAP already delivers preventive education programmes to 76,000 students. This addition to our fleet will enable us to reach even more.

LEAP's Special Needs Programme is delivered to some 3,700 students each year. During the 2006/07 academic year we improved the existing

programme and introduced additional units. These deal with physical and behavioural changes in adolescence, and teach students to be aware of unacceptable behaviour, helping to prevent unlawful physical abuse. In preparation for joining the workforce, older students are instructed in the dangers of taking drugs, and the importance of work, as well as the concept of money management.

A new milestone was reached when LEAP launched a new preventive education programme for parents, thanks to funding from the Beat Drugs Fund. The programme aims to help parents improve their parenting skills, equip them with the knowledge to recognize the warning signs of drug abuse, and raise an interactive, healthy and drug-free family.

LEAP continually strives to improve its service, and we work closely with schools to ensure that our programmes meet the needs of students. We are delighted that Matthew Lui Yue-chun, a recipient of the Outstanding Young Person Award in 2006, has agreed to support LEAP as a consultant. His journey from being a low-achieving student and a member of a triad society in his early teenage years, to a popular teacher helping young people deal with adversity, is an example to us all. I am sure our programmes will benefit greatly from his advice.

LEAP's continuing success depends largely on the support of our major sponsors, Swire and Cathay Pacific Airways; the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust, the Education Bureau, and the Narcotics Division of the Secruity Bureau. We are also grateful for the continuing support of our Health Ambassador, Andy Lau Takwah; towing companies Eastern Worldwide Co., Ltd, Sun Hing Group of Companies and Orient Trucking Hong Kong Ltd; Kwoon Chung Motors Company Ltd, and all our other friends and supporters.

Finally, I would like to thank my fellow directors and the entire LEAP team for their professionalism and invaluable contributions. LEAP would not be where it is today without this support.

Chief Executive Officer's Report

行政總監報告

Programme Development

The 2006/2007 academic year was another busy and successful one for LEAP. Our preventive education programmes, which cater to students from the ages of 5 to 15, were delivered to 75,838 students in 176 schools and two community centres, including 3,727 students in Special Needs schools.

LEAP constantly strives to update and improve its programmes to complement the changing needs of students. In the past year, we have felt a strong need to include moral and civic elements in our primary

programme. The first two topics to be introduced are Acceptance and Bullying.

New units have been added to our Special Needs Programme, thanks to support from the Jockey Club Charities Trust. These mainly address the needs of older students, helping them to make the transition from school into the wider community and the world of work.



課程發展

二零零六至二零零七學年是LEAP既充實又成功的一年。我們為一百七十六間學校及兩間社區中心,合共七萬五千八百三十八名五至十五歲的學生提供健康教育及預防藥物濫用課程,當中亦包括三千七百二十七名特殊學校的學生。

With help from the Narcotics Division's Beat Drugs Fund, our new Parent Programme was launched in November 2006. By September 2007, a total of 202 sessions had been held, involving 5,131 participants. The demand continues to increase as more parents have the desire to improve their parenting skills and gain more information about preventing drug abuse.

Strategic Review

In January 2007 we conducted a Strategic Review of LEAP's activities, which have grown considerably over the past few years, providing health-based drug prevention programmes to an increasing number of students and their parents. This enabled us to define our strategy for future expansion.

Our purpose remains to empower young people to build a healthy, safe and positive lifestyle, to resist peer pressure to experiment with drugs, and become fulfilled and responsible adults. Through our parent programme, we aim to give parents the knowledge and skills to build a positive, harmonious and drug-free family.

Launch of new Life Education Centre

Our sixth mobile Life Education Centre was officially launched on 15 March 2007 at the C.P.C. Yao Dao Primary School in Tin Shui Wai, New Territories. LEAP's Chairman, Mrs Francesca Pratt, officiated at the ceremony with guest of honour Mr William Yiu, Executive Director of the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust. School Principal Ms Vivian Chung Wing Yan gave a welcome address, and Mr Yiu handed over a symbolic key to Mr Dane Cheng, General Manager, Corporate Communications, Cathay Pacific



Airways, representing LEAP's major sponsors.

Students took part in the ceremony, acting as MCs and presenting their artwork as souvenirs to the VIP guests in Cantonese, Mandarin and English. Everyone was impressed by the excellent atmosphere in the school, a tribute to the principal, students and parents. Principal Chung emphasized that despite the negative image of Tin Shui Wai in the media, the students can realize their potential given the right encouragement. She hoped the school's synergy with LEAP would help promote a healthy lifestyle to every family in the district.

After the ceremony, the VIP guests attended a demonstration inside the new mobile classroom. The classroom is fitted with state-of-the-art audiovisual equipment including a 3D video projector to make delivery of LEAP's programmes more interesting and enjoyable for students. Multi-sensory innovations even allow the diffusion of aromas to enhance discussion on environmental issues.

Our sincere thanks go to the Jockey Club Charities Trust for generously funding the acquisition of our sixth mobile classroom, enabling LEAP to reach even more students.

Parent Programme

Our Parent Programme, launched in November 2006, has met with an overwhelming response, indicating the desire of parents to address the challenges of raising children, improve their parenting skills and gain more information about drug abuse.

By September 2007, 202 sessions had been held, involving 5,131 participants in 33 schools, as well as the Hong Kong Jockey Club Drug InfoCentre in Admiralty.

The Programme, which comprises six two-hour sessions, five on parenting skills and one on drug information, is comprehensive,

Moral Education

As circumstances in schools and society evolve, LEAP makes an ongoing effort to adapt and improve its programmes to address the

changing needs of students. This year the LEAP team has worked hard to introduce elements of moral education into our lesson plans for the Primary Programme.

The first two topics to be introduced are Acceptance and Bullying. The topic on Acceptance is designed with animal props and engaging stories to stimulate students' interest in class discussion and activities. Students learn the importance of acceptance and inclusion. The topic on Bullying asks students to reflect upon their behaviour towards the people around them. Students will be encouraged to take an active role in preventing and stopping bullying, whether they are involved as a victim or as a bystander.

Workshops and Conferences

As part of the ongoing development of educators, a number of workshops were held this year at LEAP's headquarters. In April, Ms Atty Ching, Founder and Executive Director of Teen Aids, presented an overview on sex education in Hong Kong schools. Although this topic is not yet on our agenda, we were pleased to learn from an expert in the field. In the same month, Ms Chan Shui Yu and Mr Chang Hang Fei, founder members of the Alice Theatre Laboratory, conducted a workshop for LEAP educators on drama and role play skills.

Following trial lessons for our new moral education elements at Beacon Hill School in June, LEAP invited teacher Ms Annette Leone to conduct an inspiring workshop on "Cooperative Learning" for our educators on 27 June. In August, social worker Mr Paul Lo, outreach team leader of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in the northern New Territories, gave a talk providing valuable insights into drug abuse trends

among teenagers. On 17 October, Kassandra Boyd of Hong Kong Academy Primary School gave a presentation on the International Baccalaureate programme. As more Hong Kong schools are now adopting the IB and its associated Primary Years Programme, this was very helpful for our educators to better understand the curriculum model.

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issues at an early age. He was sure LEAP would continue to make a difference in shaping the lives of many more Hong Kong students.

Consultant

Dr Rose Ong, Head of the Corporate Medical Department, Cathay Pacific Airways, has agreed to support LEAP as a consultant with effect from September 2007. On 13 December, Dr Ong visited a class in action at Kowloon Junior School. After the session, she shared her views on the programme and made some suggestions to us. We are sure that Dr Ong's expert medical advice will be very helpful in the development of our new programmes.

Community Involvement

On 10 November, a team of LEAP educators participated in the organization Teen Aids' annual event "Family Aids Education 2007" to promote AIDS prevention and sex education in the family. Held in Shatin Park, the event included performances, discussions and game booths. LEAP designed and manned one of the game booths

about sex education, aimed at both children and their parents, reminding them of appropriate methods and attitudes towards sex education in the family.

LEAP supported the Hong Kong Council on Smoking and Health (COSH) in its "Smoke Free Environments - Create and Enjoy" Photo Collection Campaign. Children were invited to take photos of some fun activities in a smoke-free environment and submit them, along with a brief description,

after the summer holidays. This followed LEAP's own campaign in favour of smoke-free legislation in Hong Kong conducted in 2006, when 16 Young Reporters conducted a survey in Mongkok and Shatin, and later presented their report and a 7-point "Smoke-free Appeal" to the Legislative Council.

Life Education Macao

Life Education Macao continues to thrive, with many more students benefiting from its programmes. In 2007, 20,715 primary students, including special needs students and those using the English programme, and 10,206 secondary students received Life Education Macao's programmes.

Life Education Macao has now expanded its services to provide programmes for students with learning difficulties. Following a teaching demonstration in Macao in May 2006 by LEAP, a year later Special Needs Educator Alex Lo went to Macao to provide actual training.

Life Education Macao is currently using three of the 14 Special Needs units and will expand gradually. LEAP looks forward to continuing to provide support and training to Life Education Macao.

澳門健康生活教育

澳門健康生活教育不斷茁壯成長,讓越來越多 學生從課程中受惠。在二零零七年,二萬零七 百一十五名小學生,當中包括參與英文課程及 就讀特殊學校的學生,以及一萬零二百零六名 中學生曾參與澳門健康生活教育的課程。

Future Directions

Thanks to the support of our sponsors, the cooperation of participating schools, and a dedicated team of educators, LEAP is continually strengthening its efforts to deliver preventive health education programmes to Hong Kong students.

LEAP now has a fleet of six mobile Life Education Centres and a static centre, and operates programmes for students aged from 5 to 15; a Special Needs programme; and a Parent Programme. Our philosophy is one of cooperation between schools, family and community to prevent substance abuse and promote a healthy lifestyle.

In his October 2007 Policy Address, Chief Executive Donald Tsang, the Patron of LEAP, expressed his deep concern about the problem of juvenile drug abuse in Hong Kong. He echoed the anxiety of police, social workers, teachers and the entire Hong Kong community at the increasing number of teenage drug abusers, with recent figures showing a rise in arrests for drug-related offences. Mr Tsang announced his intention to appoint a senior government task force led by the Secretary for Justice to tackle this issue.

The task force will make use of existing anti-crime and anti-narcotics networks to consolidate strategies to combat drug abuse among young people. Members of the Action Committee Against Narcotics (ACAN) welcomed this move and said they would continue to give their best advice to the government. LEAP, too, looks forward to working with the Government and other non-government organizations in the battle against drugs.

董事會

兩位董事會新成員冼愛敏及傅赫庭,分別於 二零零七年三月及九月加入董事會。

未來動向

有賴各贊助人的支持、參與學校的協助及一 群盡心盡力的教育幹事,LEAP將繼續致力 為香港學生提供健康及藥物教育課程。

LEAP現時有六所流動教育中心及一所固定中心,為五至十五歲學生提供服務;同時亦提供特殊教育課程及家長教育課程。我們的理念是透過學校、家庭及社會的合作,致力預防藥物濫用及提倡健康的生活方式。

LEAP的贊助人,特區行政長官曾蔭權先生,於二零零七年十月的施政報告中表示他對香港青少年藥物濫用問題的深切關注。對於青少年濫用藥物的人數不斷增加,及近日因濫藥而觸犯法例的數字亦有所上升,曾特首和警方、社工、老師以致社會各界人士同樣感到憂慮;為此,他宣佈委任律政司司長領導一個政府高層專責小組處理有關事宜。

專責小組會以現存的滅罪及反吸毒網絡為基礎,整合打擊青少年藥物濫用的策略。禁毒常務委員會成員歡迎該行動並表示會繼續向政府提出建議。LEAP亦期待與政府及非政府團體合作致力打擊藥物濫用。





LEAP — Who We Are

生活教育活動計劃

Life Education Activity Programme (LEAP) is a registered charity that provides internationally recognized health awareness and drug prevention programmes for primary and secondary schoolchildren. It helps them establish a healthy lifestyle and become aware of the dangers of drugs, including cigarettes and alcohol. LEAP's programmes are endorsed by the Hong Kong SAR Government's Education Bureau and Narcotics Division of the Security Bureau.



LEAP是一個註冊慈善團體,專為中、小學的學生提供一套國際認可的健康教育及預防藥物濫用課程,旨在讓他們明白到健康生活的重要及濫用藥物的危險。課程獲教育局及保安局禁毒處認可。

Life Education originated in Australia. The first Life Education Centre was established in 1979 by the Reverend Ted Noffs in Sydney, Australia. The concept spread throughout Australia and then internationally. Today Life Education operates in the UK, New Zealand, Thailand, Indonesia, South Africa, Hungary, Finland, Cyprus, Hong Kong and Macao.

LEAP was founded in Hong Kong in 1994. Our primary programme is taken to schools in specially designed mobile Life Education Centres (LECs), which can be driven all over the territory. LEAP now operates six mobile centres and one static centre, as well as a secondary school programme. Our programmes reach some 76,000 schoolchildren annually, including 3,700 students with Special Needs. In October 2006, LEAP launched "Safe and Successful", a programme which aims at equipping parents with skills to help their children establish correct values and to prevent substance abuse.

The LECs are designed to provide a relaxed environment for youngsters to enjoy the programme and become involved in discussions and role-play. Our specially trained educators make use of a modern audio-visual system, illuminated models of the human body, a 'talking brain' and games in the delivery of the programme. LEAP mascots Harold the Giraffe and Holly the Horse reinforce healthy living messages by talking and singing with the children. Our aim is to provide a step-by-step approach to learning about the body and how drugs affect it. Role-play helps develop social competency skills that enable children to make responsible decisions and to say 'No' without losing friends or face.

LEAP has its own training centre, where our educators undergo intensive training to deliver and direct the programmes.

生活教育概念源於澳洲, 首間生活教育中心由

Ted Noffs牧師於一九七九年在澳洲悉尼創辦,之後此概念傳遍澳洲,並擴展至世界各地。時至今日,生活教育已在英國、新西蘭、泰國、印尼、南非、匈牙利、芬蘭、塞浦路斯、香港及澳門運作。

LEAP於一九九四年在香港成立,以設計獨特之「流動生活教育中心」將生活教育課程帶進全港各區的小學。現時已有六所流動生活教育中心、一所固定教育中心及中學課程同時運作,每年為約七萬六千名學生提供服務,包括三千七百名特殊學校的學生。二零零六年十月,LEAP更推行「新一代健康成長錦囊」的家長教育課程,以裝備家長協助子女建立正確的價值觀,抗衡藥物的引誘。

生活教育中心設計新穎獨特,為學生營造輕鬆愉快的學習環境。受過特別訓練的教育幹事們,利用中心內的先進影音器材、會發亮的人體模型、會說話的腦袋及各式互動遊戲授課。而LEAP的吉祥物「長頸鹿哈樂」及「小馬凱莉」更會在課程期間跟學生說笑及唱歌,從而進一步鞏固健康訊息。LEAP透過循序漸進的教學方式,讓學生認識人體的結構及藥物對它的影響;而角色扮演更能協助學生建立社交技巧,懂得如何作出正確的抉擇,有信心地拒絕煙酒等藥物並同時保存自尊及友誼。

此外,LEAP特設訓練中心,為教育幹事提供 嚴格訓練以傳授及策劃課程。

Notes to Financial Statements 帳項

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The Company is a registered charity, incorporated in Hong Kong with liability limited by guarantee. The address of its registered office is 3rd Floor, Chung On Hall, 15 Stubbs Road, Hong Kong.

The Company was engaged in providing health-based education programmes.

2. ADOPTION OF NEW AND REVISED HKFRSs

In the current year, the Company has adopted all the new and revised Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards ("HKFRSs") issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("HKICPA") that are relevant to its operations and effective for accounting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2006. HKFRSs comprise Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards ("HKFRS"); Hong Kong Accounting Standards ("HKAS"); and Interpretations. The adoption of these new and revised HKFRSs did not result in substantial changes to the Company's accounting polices and amounts reported for the current year and prior years.

The Company has not applied the new HKFRSs that have been issued but are not yet effective. The application of these new HKFRSs will not have material impact on the financial statements of the Company.

3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with HKFRSs issued by the HKICPA, accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong and the applicable disclosures required by the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance.

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below.

(a) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance are expensed in the income and expenditure account during the period in which they are incurred.

Depreciation of property, plant and equipment is calculated at rates sufficient to write off their cost less residual values over the estimated useful lives on a straight line basis. The principal annual rates are as follows:

Mobile classroom	12.5% - 20%
Motor vehicles	33.33%
Office equipment	33.33%
Office decoration	33.33%
Promotional material	33 33%

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation method are reviewed and adjusted, if appropriate, at each balance sheet date.

(b) Resale items

Resale items represent pens, toys, bags, T-shirts and erasers purchased for resale and are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is determined using the first-in, first-out basis. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price less the estimated costs necessary to make the sale.

(c) Trade and other receivables

Trade and other receivables are recognised initially at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less allowance for impairment. An allowance for impairment of trade and other receivables is established when there is objective evidence that the Company will not be able to collect all amounts due according to the original terms of the receivables. The amount of the allowance is the difference between the receivables' carrying amount and the present value of estimated future cash flows, discounted at the effective interest rate computed at initial recognition. The amount of the allowance is recognised in the income and expenditure account.



Impairment losses are reversed in subsequent periods and recognised in the income and expenditure account when an increase in the receivables' recoverable amount can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment was recognised, subject to the restriction that the carrying amount of the receivables at the date the impairment is reversed shall not exceed what the amortised cost would have been had the impairment not been recognised.

(d) Cash and cash equivalents

For the purpose of the cash flow statement, cash and cash equivalents represent cash at bank and on hand, demand deposits with banks and other financial institutions, and short-term highly liquid investments which are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and subject to an insignificant risk of change in value. Bank overdrafts which are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the Company's cash management are also included as a component of cash and cash equivalents.

(e) Other payables

Other payables are stated initially at their fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the effect of discounting would be immaterial, in which case they are stated at cost.

(f) Revenue recognition

The Company relies on sponsorship from major corporations to cover the majority of the costs of running its programme. Educators' salaries are funded mainly by specific organisations. Sponsorship and Educator subsidies are recognised as income evenly over the period specified by the donors. Amounts relating to future accounting periods are shown in the balance sheet as advance funding. Other income reflects the results of fund raising for capital equipment and future contingencies and is recognised upon receipt.

Interest income is recognised on a time apportionment basis using the effective interest method.

(g) Employee benefits

(i) Employee leave entitlement

Employee entitlements to annual leave and long service leave are recognised when they accrue to employees. A provision is made for the estimated liability for annual leave and long service leave as a result of services rendered by employees up to the balance sheet date.

Employee entitlements to sick leave and maternity leave are not recognised until the time of leave.

(ii) Pension obligations

The Company contributes to defined contribution retirement schemes which are available to all employees. Contributions to the schemes by the Company and employees are calculated as a percentage of employees' basic salaries. The retirement benefit scheme cost charged to the income and expenditure account represents contributions payable by the Company to the funds.

(h) Impairment of assets

At each balance sheet date the Company reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have suffered an impairment loss. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated in order to determine the extent of any impairment loss.

Recoverable amount is the higher of fair value less costs to sell and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset.

If the recoverable amount of an asset is estimated to be less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount of the asset is reduced to its recoverable amount. An impairment loss is recognised immediately in the income and expenditure account, unless the relevant asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which case the impairment loss is treated as a revaluation decrease.

Where an impairment loss subsequently reverses, the carrying amount of the asset is increased to the revised estimate of its recoverable amount, but so that the increased carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined (net of amortisation or depreciation) had no impairment loss been recognised for the asset in prior years. A reversal of an impairment loss is recognised immediately in the income and expenditure account, unless the relevant asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which case the reversal of the impairment loss is treated as a revaluation increase.



4. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT

The Company's activities expose it to a variety of financial risks: liquidity risk and cash flow interest rate risk. The Company's overall risk management programme focuses on the unpredictability of financial markets and seeks to minimise potential adverse effects on the Company's financial performance.

(a) Liquidity risk

The Company's policy is to regularly monitor current and expected liquidity requirements to ensure that it maintains sufficient reserves of cash to meet its liquidity requirements in the short and longer term.

(b) Cash flow interest rate risk

The Company has significant bank and cash balances that are interest bearing and is exposed to cash flow interest rate risk. Interest rate risk is controlled through benchmark duration guidelines and by allocating the bank balances strategically into fixed and floating instruments.

(c) Fair values

The carrying amounts of the Company's financial assets and financial liabilities as reflected in the balance sheet approximate their respective fair values.

9. SPECIAL DONATION

In August 2006 the Company received a special donation from Cathay Pacific Airways Limited in the form of 1,800,000 shares in China National Aviation Company Limited ("CNAC"). On 21 June 2006, Air China Limited ("Air China") had announced a scheme of arrangement to privatise CNAC by acquiring all the shares it did not already own at a price of HK\$2.80 per share. In December 2006, the Company accepted the offer from Air China, but the scheme of arrangement did not become effective until it was sanctioned by the Court on 9 January 2007. Accordingly the donated shares are shown in the balance sheet as a special donation valued at the price offered by Air China. The proceeds from the sale of the shares totalling HK\$5,040,000 were received in February 2007.

10. APPROVAL OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements were approved and authorised for issue by the Board of Directors on 21 June 2007.
